

## **Pastor's Article**

Soon, 45 people will be embarking on our 2nd Civil Rights trip (April 11-19). Our group is made up of travelers from our community as well as a few joining us from out-of-town (as far away as Los Angeles). We're members of mainline Christian denominations, Moses Montefiore Temple, Mennonite, and Unitarian Universalists. The various denominations represented include United Methodists (Normal 1st, Calvary, Wesley, & Peoria 1st), Presbyterians, Lutheran, Catholic, and Episcopal.

We have been meeting regularly since last October to get to know one another, to study the book *The 1619 Project*, and to learn more about the places we'll be visiting. Our preparation has helped us understand better the complexities of the work for freedom and justice. It has reminded us of the countless extraordinary people who dedicated their lives to the cause of Civil Rights and freedom.

And our learning has given us a moreinformed lens to look at our communities, state, and country today. What are the policies and practices that are being reversed in terms of Civil Rights? Where are the places that have never been inclusive and just and still need our attention?

One of the books I read recently is titled Shaking the Gates of Hell by John Archibald. "Archibald had seen his father, the Rev. Robert L. Archibald, Jr., the son and grandson of Methodist preachers, as a moral authority, a moderating force during the racial turbulence of the '60s, a loving and dependable parent, a forgiving and attentive minister, a man many Alabamians came to see as a saint. But was that enough? Even though [John] Archibald grew up in Alabama in the heart of the Civil Rights movement, he could recall few words

about racial rights or wrongs from his father's pulpit at a time the South seethed, and this began to haunt him." We could look back over history and ask why others didn't do more. But more importantly, we can look at ourselves today and ask, "how are we doing what we can to help others who are not seen, not recognized, not respected or given the same rights as we are?"

That question has been lingering with me and I hope it will linger with you as well. As the group is traveling, we invite you to "travel" with us in learning about history while wrestling with what is our role today to help ensure and protect people's Civil Rights.


